INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF GREENWEIZ PROJECTS LIMITED

 We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of GREENWEIZ PROJECTS LIMITED which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2017, the Statement of Profit and Loss and also the cash flow statement of the company for the year then ended, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters in section 134(5) 2. of the Companies Act, 2013 with respect to preparation and presentation of these standalone financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India including the Accounting Standard specified under section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. - 5. (1) Significant Accounting Policies:

(a) Accounting Convention

The Accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and on accrual system basis on the principle of going concern.

(c) Expenditure

(d) Fixed assets and Depreciation

(e) Inventories

(q) Impairment of Assets

If the carrying amount of assets exceeds the recoverable amount on the reporting date, the carrying amount is reduced to the recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is measured as the higher of the net selling price and the value in use determined by the present value of estimated future cash flows.

(h) Foreign currency transactions

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at current exchange rates ruling at the date of transaction. Liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are restated at the rates ruling at the year end or at rates under outstanding forward exchange contracts entered into. The profit/loss so determined and realised exchange gains or losses are recognised in the profit & loss account, as appropriate.
